LICENTIATE IN DOGMATIC THEOLOGY

The program develops a comprehensive, deep and systematic knowledge of dogmatic theology with expertise in specific areas.

In our program, in addition to studying the great masters such as St. Thomas, we give special relevance to deepening the theological thought of J. Ratzinger as an example of dialogue between faith and contemporary culture.

Who should apply?

Whoever intends to transmit a well-ordered knowledge of the faith in church leadership positions, major seminaries or equivalent schools, and those who wish to proceed with a Doctor's degree.

LICENTIATE IN SPIRITUAL THEOLOGY

The program emphasizes the mystery of Christ and of the Church at the center of the spiritual life nurtured by the prayerful reading of Sacred Scripture and modeled on the examples of the Saints.

In our program, in addition to studying the great masters of the spiritual life, we give special relevance to the competencies for being a spiritual director, formator, and director of spiritual exercises.

Who should apply?

Whoever intends to apply the theoretical and practical knowledge of spiritual theology as spiritual directors or directors of spiritual exercises, future teachers in major seminaries or equivalent schools, and those who wish to proceed with a Doctor's degree.
